

2010 MYSTERY QUILT

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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

This is a nice little mystery that won't take much time. It makes a small wall hanging (28" x 28").

You will need:

- **Fabric A** – 3/4 yd white, muslin or neutral
- **Fabric B** – 1/2 yard - color of your choice
- **Fabric C** – 1/4 yard - color of your choice
- **Fabric D** – 1/4 yard - color of your choice
- **Backing** – 7/8 yard

SUGGESTED COLOR COMBINATIONS

Fabric B, C and D should be distinctly different and should contrast from **Fabric A**.

Example 1: **Fabric B, C and D** can be prints (pink, green, blue); and
Fabric A - white

OR

Example 2: **Fabrics B, C, D** – red, yellow and orange and
Fabric A - black.

For example: You can substitute black for white in **Fabric A** and use batiks in 3 different colors for **Fabric B, C, and D**.

This is YOUR quilt, make it YOUR way...and have fun!!!

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

ONLY CUT FABRIC USING OPTION 1 OR OPTION 2, NOT BOTH

OPTION 1 – Use this Option if you bought fabric by YARD

FABRIC A – (white, muslin, neutral, black or your choice)

1. Cut Four 2 1/2" strips of white (strip from selvedge to selvedge will be 2 1/2 by width of fabric 42")
2. From these strips cross cut twenty (20) 2 1/2" squares and twenty (20) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" pieces.
3. Cut one (1) 5 1/4" strip from selvedge to selvedge, cross cut into 4 squares.
4. Cut these squares on the diagonal twice (an X) making triangles. (See Diagram 1) You will get 16 triangles.

5. Cut one (1) 4 1/2" strip, cut into 4 1/2" squares. You will need 5.

FABRIC B

1. Cut one 5 inch strip - - from this, cut seven 5 inch squares.
2. Cross cut two on the diagonal one time to make four half square triangles.
3. Cut five in half twice to make twenty 2 1/2" squares.
4. Cut two 2 1/2" strips for the border.

FABRIC C

1. Cut one 5 inch strip - - from this, cut five 5 inch squares.
2. Cross cut three on the diagonal to make six half square triangles – this will make 6 triangles.
3. Cut two in half twice to make eight 2 1/2" squares.
4. Cut the remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide, then cut two 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares.
5. Cut one 2 1/2" strip for the border.

FABRIC D

1. Cut one 5 inch strip - - from this, cut six 5 inch squares.
2. Cross cut three on the diagonal to make six half square triangles
3. Cut three in half twice to make twelve 2 1/2" squares
4. Cut the remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide, then cut two 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares.
5. Cut one 2 1/2" strip for the border.

OPTION 2 – Use this Option if you bought fabric by FAT QUARTERS

FABRIC A

Need 3/4 yard NOT Fat Quarter – (white, muslin, neutral, black or your choice) - same as instructions above.

FABRIC B

Need 1/2 yard NOT Fat Quarter – same as instructions above.

FABRIC C

Need Fat Quarter - should be about 18 X 22, cut strips along longest edge.

1. Cut two 5 inch strips of longest edge - from this, cut five 5 inch squares
2. Cross cut three on the diagonal to make six half square triangles – this will make 6 triangles
3. Cut two in half twice to make eight 2 1/2" squares
4. Cut the remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide, then cut two 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares.
5. Cut two 2 1/2" strips for the border.

FABRIC D – Fat Quarter

Need Fat Quarter

1. Cut two 5 inch strips of longest edge - - from this, cut six 5 inch squares.
2. Cross cut three on the diagonal to make six half square triangles
3. Cut three in half twice to make twelve 2 1/2" squares
4. Cut the remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide, then cut two 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares.
5. Cut two 2 1/2" strips for the border.
