

## Block #3

I have found several names for this block, including Double Sawtooth Star Block, Rising Star and Double Star.

### Fabric #1

- Print 1 - 1 squares  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$

### Fabric #2

- Print 1 - 4 squares  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$
- Print 2 - 4 rectangles  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$
- Print 3 - 4 squares  $2'' \times 2''$  – draw a diagonal line on back of squares
- Print 4 – 4 squares  $2'' \times 2''$  - draw a diagonal line on back of squares

### Fabric #3

- Print 1 - 4 squares  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$  – draw a diagonal line on back of squares
- Print 2 - 4 squares  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$  - draw a diagonal line on back of squares
- Print 3 – 4 rectangles  $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$
- Print 4 – 4 squares  $2'' \times 2''$

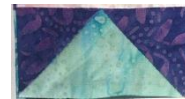
#### A. Make 4 Flying Geese using Fabric #2, Print 2 Rectangles and the 8 Fabric #3 squares with drawn diagonal lines.

1. Place a square on a rectangle & sew on the drawn line.
2. Flip over and press. Check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle.
3. Trim away the excess corner fabric leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam.
4. Make 4 (measures  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ )



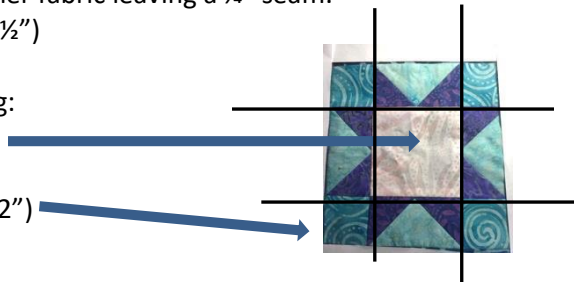
#### B. Make 4 Flying Geese using Fabric #3, Print 3 Rectangles and the 8 Fabric #2 squares with drawn diagonal lines.

1. Place a square on a rectangle & sew on the drawn line.
2. Flip over and press. Check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle.
3. Trim away the excess corner fabric leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam.
4. Make 4 (measures  $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ )



#### C. Make inner star as shown using:

1. Fabric #1 as inner square
2. 4 small flying geese
3. Fabric #3, 4 squares ( $2'' \times 2''$ )



#### D. Sew together using small star as inner block to create $12\frac{1}{2}''$ square:
